Patrick Huck, MD, MBA, FACS, CPE, is a board-certified general surgeon, specializing in comprehensive general surgery with a focus on complex wound management and minimally invasive and narcotic-sparing techniques. Dr. Huck received his medical degree from Northeast Ohio

Medical University in Rootstown, Ohio, and completed his general surgery residency at Summa Health System — Akron City Hospital, in Akron, Ohio. Dr. Huck also earned a Master of Business Administration in Healthcare Leadership from Ashland University, in Ashland, Ohio.

Dr. Huck serves as an assistant professor of surgery in the Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine. His clinical interests include laparoscopic colectomy, complex hernia repair, and robotic/endoscopic procedures, along with gallbladder disease and complex abdominal wall reconstruction.

As a former Active Duty Air Force General Surgeon at Uniformed Services University of The Health Sciences, and more recently at Ohio University Heritage College of Osteopathic Medicine, Dr. Huck has a long history of teaching medical students and residents. A significant portion of his career has been focused on surgery quality, safety, surgical mentorship, and coaching.

Dr. Huck looks forward to fostering collaboration between the science faculty of MSU's Department of Biochemistry and MSU Health Care's clinical faculty in helping translational research in the areas of colon cancer, gut microbiome, and wound healing. He joined Michigan State University in May 2025.
